



Following is an update on the list of shutdown orders in Texas counties. Please keep in mind this information is current as of the date outlined and is subject to change. We recommend visiting each counties' website for the most up-to-date information.

Texas (new orders in addition to those already announced in [Bell County](#), [Bexar County](#), [Chambers County](#), [Collin County](#), [Dallas County](#), [El Paso County](#), [Fort Bend County](#), [Galveston County](#), [Harris County](#), [Hunt County](#), [Liberty County](#), [McLennan County](#), [Robertson County](#), [Tarrant County](#), [Travis County](#), and [Williamson County](#) – all of which took effect on or after March 23)

- "Stay Safe at Home" [order](#) will take effect at 6 p.m. on March 26 and remain effective until 11:59 p.m. on April 30. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in "Essential Activities," to perform "Essential Government Functions," or to operate "Essential Businesses." All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as "Essential Businesses" must cease all activities except for working from home.

- Stay at home [order](#) will take effect at 11:59 p.m. on March 26 and remain effective until 11:59 p.m. on April 9. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in "Essential Activities," to perform "Essential Government Functions," or to operate "Essential Businesses." All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as "Essential Businesses" must cease all activities except for working from home.

Hays County (as of 3/26 PM) – [Click here](#) for county website information

- Stay at home [order](#) will take effect at 11 p.m. on March 26 and remain effective until 4 a.m. on April 10. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in "Essential Activities," to perform "Essential Government Functions," or to operate "Essential Businesses." All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as "Essential Businesses" must cease all activities except for working from home. The Order also includes a curfew (11 p.m. to 4 a.m.), except for essential workers whose employment requires it.

- Stay at home [order](#) will take effect at 11:59 p.m. on March 27 and remain effective until 11:59 p.m. on April 10. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in "Essential Activities," to perform "Essential Government Functions," or to operate "Essential Businesses." All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as "Essential Businesses" must cease all activities except for working from home.

Montgomery County (as of 3/26 PM) – [Click here](#) for county website information

- No shelter in place, but [amendment to occupancy order](#), taking effect 8 a.m. on March 26 and continuing through April 6, requires closure of hair/nail salons, spas, massage businesses, tattoo parlors, and cosmetic businesses. Restaurants must cease onsite dining operations, and bars/private clubs must cease operations.

- Stay at home [order](#) will take effect at 11:59 p.m. on March 26 and continue until 11:59 p.m. on April 8. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in "Essential Activities," to perform "Essential Government Functions," or to operate "Essential Businesses." All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as "Essential Businesses" must cease all activities except for working from home.

- Stay at home [order](#) will take effect at 11:59 p.m. on March 27 and remain effective until 11:59 p.m. on April 3. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in “Essential Activities,” to perform “Essential Government Functions,” or to operate “Essential Businesses.” All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as “Essential Businesses” must cease all activities except for working from home.

- Stay at home [order](#) will take effect at 11:59 p.m. on March 26 and remain effective until 11:59 p.m. on April 9. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in “Exempted Activities,” to perform “Governmental Functions,” or to operate “Exempted Businesses.” All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as “Exempted Businesses” must stop operations and close except for working from home.

San Jacinto County (as of 3/25 PM) – [Click here](#) for county website information

- Stay at home [order](#) will take effect at 11:59 p.m. on March 25 and remain effective until 11:59 p.m. on April 19. Residents must stay at home unless engaged in “Exempted Activities,” to perform “Governmental Functions,” or to operate “Exempted Businesses.” All businesses/operations other than those defined in the order as “Exempted Businesses” must stop operations and close except for working from home; IT/other operations that facilitate working from home; and operations necessary to maintain security, upkeep, and maintenance of premises, equipment or inventory.

- Scurry County issued a Shelter-in-Place [order](#) that went into effect at 11:59 p.m. on Friday, March 27. Essential businesses such as healthcare, residence care, veterinary care, some government organizations, construction, utilities, infrastructure, and national security will remain open and those residents will be permitted to work. Grocery stores will also remain open with only a certain number of shoppers permitted to enter. Other businesses can also remain open under strict guidelines. Individuals performing essential activities, such as buying food, medical supplies, caring for a person or pet, will still be allowed to leave their homes.
